"The week before going to school, I had meeting with the principal and a teacher in-charged with English language immersion program. We discussed on the program, syllabus and my role as a teaching assistant. I was assigned to help 6 classes which consisting of two classes from each fourth, fifth and sixth grades respectively.

On my first week as an ELTA, I helped 6th grade in baseball game in the Physical Education (PE) class. Before the game, I introduced words related to the game, particularly some basic game equipment, setting and proceeded to pronunciation and use them properly. After the briefing, we played baseball together and encourage the students to use commonly used phrases in baseball game.

As for 5th grade, I was assigned to help a special-needs student in the use of computer for finishing homework. It was quite challenging due to his momentarily attention. 4th grade on the other hand, are still playful. I mainly helped on the introduction of their learning materials by reading, particularly emphasizing the proper pronunciation. Simply put, my first week classes mainly on getting know the students and be familiar with their struggles and hardship.

On the second week as an ELTA, I helped both of the 6th grade classes in the cooking lesson. Before the lesson, students were introduced with some basic utensils, cooking ware, ingredients and processes. Throughout the lesson, I talked and encourage them to use commonly used phrases while preparing their dish. At the end, I teach on how to offer, compliment and giving feedback to the food.

As for 5th grade, I helped on two special-needs students to work on their reading and writing. It was quite successful as they were paired up instead of learning alone. Therefor there's a small competition happened in between and encouraged both of them to participate and talk. As for 4th grade, the introduction of their learning materials continued in the form of writing exercise. Most of the students recognized the Roman alphabets but having difficulties to start writing. I used the "show first technique and students followed afterwards" to teach them on how to start write."


